Welcome to the first newsletter from the G7 Engagement Hub Team. We work alongside the policing and security teams who are planning for the delivery of the G7 Summit in June. Our role is to understand and respond to concerns and questions from the community about the Summit and ensure that planning details that will affect the public can be shared as quickly as possible. This fortnightly newsletter will be one of the ways we do this.

What is the G7 Summit?

The G7 Summit is being held in Cornwall over the weekend of 11–13 June 2021. It is the annual meeting of seven nations to discuss economic policy and other matters of State. This year a number of guest countries have also been invited. Key locations of the summit include:

- The Carbis Bay Hotel, Carbis Bay.
- The Tregenna Castle Resort, St Ives.
- The National Maritime Museum, Falmouth.
- Cornwall Airport, Newquay.

Disruption Updates:

As exciting as it is to be welcoming the G7 Summit to our small corner of the globe, the policing operation to deliver a safe and secure event is significant and will inevitably lead to some disruption for local people, particularly those who live or work near to one of the key venues. Frequently Asked Questions

We will update this section to share answers to the most frequently asked questions from our engagement with the public over the past two weeks:

Will there be protests during the G7 Summit?

We expect protest activity linked to the G7 Summit. Police Protest Liaison Teams are linking in with organisers to support this important human right by facilitating peaceful and lawful protest whilst minimising disruption to the public.

Will the Metropolitan Police be in command of the protest response and other aspects of the policing operation?

No. Devon and Cornwall Police officers retain command and control of all elements of the policing operation. We will be drawing on skills and resources from other forces across the country, but local people can expect visiting officers to uphold the approachable community-policing style they have come to expect from their local officers.

Will COVID-19 risks be managed in the policing operation?

Yes. Careful planning is ongoing to minimise any risk of increased transmission of COVID-19 during the G7 Summit. This includes a comprehensive testing programme for all officers and staff deployed at the event as well as working in operational 'bubbles'.
