## New radio mast to be built

A temporary mast is due to be built in Porthrepta Car Park, St Ives, to provide crucial support needed for emergency service radio cover during the G7 Leaders' Summit.

The mast will provide additional support to the existing masts in the area, expanding the capability of the Airwave Network – a secure network used by the emergency services.

The mast is temporary and will be disassembled following the conclusion of the Summit.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **Devon and Cornwall Police say they are running the security operation, aren't world leaders bringing their own security?**

All the world leaders and delegates will be bringing their own security teams with them. Devon & Cornwall Police retain responsibility for the planning and implementation of the wider security operation, including venue security, access control, security and escort on the routes used by the Protected Persons, as well as ensuring the public and those engaged in work at the venues remain safe from harm.
